Pennington Foundation

WOW... where did 2023 go? Christmas is just 53 days away! For most of you, this email is a repeat of years past. For others, this is all new information. Please read carefully to avoid missing deadline dates and confusion. For the 4th year in a row, the Pennington Foundation has graciously gifted locally placed children in WCHSA custody with unbelievable generosity. We have already gotten through the first 2 phases of this grant (School Supplies and Clothing) and are trudging along with the final phase for 2023... Christmas gift shopping! To sign up for and attend a CHRISTMAS shopping day, please email requested date and time (listed) to hsa-penningtonproject@washoecounty.gov. To reiterate from past emails, this program is ONLY for children currently in the custody of WCHSA who are placed outside of their parents' homes and who reside in Washoe County/Northern Nevada whose care-provider can attend these shopping days in person. If this does not make sense or there is confusion, please contact Jesse Brown at the FEC 775-352-3230 or reply to this email.

Important things to note:

1. After emailing requested date/time to hsa-penningtonproject@washoecounty.gov and providing your name, the names of the children you will be shopping for and the requested date/check out time, you will receive a response that your request was received and any additional information needed. Please call the FEC (775-352-3230) to follow up on your request or to sign up for a shopping day by phone if you haven't gotten a response after 72 hours.
2. Once you arrive at the Sparks Target store (Legends Mall), you **must check-in at the table** located inside the store to obtain your 'shopping pass' at a time that HSA staff are present (we will be there NO EARLIER than one hour prior to the first check out time listed below. If the first check out time is 1:00 pm, we will be present at the store at 12:00 noon but not earlier). Give yourself enough time to shop before your check-out time.
3. Again, please DO NOT show up and expect to check out earlier than our first check out time.
4. **Separate items by child** if you have more than one child you are shopping for. For most children, you will have about \$250.00 to spend on Christmas gifts.
5. WCHSA staff will be present at each event to assist you.
6. When done shopping, you will move to one of 2 check stands with WCHSA staff who will purchase your items. You must arrive in line no later than your check-out time (the time you sign up for).
7. **Unlike Clothing shopping days, children should not be in attendance at these events – Christmas gifts should be surprises.**
8. We are allowing one shopping day per child for Christmas so all the items you choose will need to be made on your scheduled day/time.

UAU... ¿A dónde se fue el 2023? ¡Faltan solo 53 días para la Navidad! Para la mayoría de ustedes, este correo electrónico es una repetición de años pasados. Para otros, toda esta información es nueva. Por favor, lea atentamente para evitar la pérdida de fechas límite y la confusión. Por 4º año consecutivo, la Fundación Pennington ha obsequiado gentilmente a los niños colocados localmente bajo la custodia de WCHSA con una generosidad increíble. Ya hemos superado las 2 primeras fases de esta subvención (Útiles Escolares y Ropa) y estamos avanzando penosamente con la fase final para 2023... ¡Compras de regalos de Navidad! Para inscribirse y asistir a un día de compras de NAVIDAD, envíe por correo electrónico la fecha y hora solicitadas (de las que se enumeran a continuación) a hsa-penningtonproject@washoecounty.gov. Para reiterar de correos electrónicos anteriores, este programa es SOLO para niños actualmente bajo la custodia de WCHSA que son colocados fuera de los hogares de sus padres y que residen en el Condado de Washoe/Norte de Nevada cuyo proveedor de cuidado puede asistir a estos días de compras en persona. Si esto no tiene sentido o hay confusión, comuníquese con Jesse Brown al FEC 775-352-3230 o responda a este correo electrónico.

Cosas importantes para tener en cuenta:

1. Después de enviar por correo electrónico la fecha / hora solicitada a hsa-penningtonproject@washoecounty.gov y proporcionar su nombre, los nombres de los niños para los que comprará y la fecha / hora de salida solicitada, recibirá una respuesta de que se recibió su solicitud y cualquier información adicional necesaria. Llame a la FEC (775-352-3230) para hacer un seguimiento de su solicitud o para inscribirse en un día de compras por teléfono si no ha recibido una respuesta después de 72 horas.

2. Una vez que llegue a la tienda Sparks Target (Legends Mall), **debe registrarse en la mesa** ubicada dentro de la tienda para obtener su 'pase de compras' a la hora en que el personal de HSA esté presente (estaremos allí **NO ANTES DE UNA HORA** antes de la primera hora de salida que se indica a continuación. Si la primera hora de salida es a las 1:00 pm, estaremos presentes en la tienda a las 12:00 pm pero no antes). Tómese el tiempo suficiente para comprar antes de la hora de salida.
3. Una vez más, por favor **NO** se presente y espere salir antes de nuestra primera hora de salida.
4. **Separe los artículos por niño si tiene más de un niño para el que está comprando. Para la mayoría de los niños, tendrá alrededor de \$ 250.00 para gastar en regalos de Navidad.**
5. El personal de WCHSA estará presente en cada evento para ayudarlo.
6. Cuando termine de comprar, se trasladará a uno de los 2 puestos de control con el personal de WCHSA que comprará sus artículos. Debes llegar a la fila a más tardar a la hora de salida (la hora a la que te registras).
7. **A diferencia de los días de compra de ropa, los niños no deben asistir a estos eventos: los regalos de Navidad deben ser sorpresas.**
8. Estamos permitiendo un día de compras por niño para Navidad, por lo que todos los artículos que elija deberán hacerse en su día/hora programado.

Did you know?

NRS 202.485

Leaving child unattended in motor vehicle; penalty; exception.

1. A parent, legal guardian or other person responsible for a child who is 7 years of age or younger shall not knowingly and intentionally leave that child in a motor vehicle if:

(a) The conditions present a significant risk to the health and safety of the child; or

(b) The engine of the motor vehicle is running or the keys to the vehicle are in the ignition unless the child is being supervised by and within the sight of a person who is at least 12 years of age.

Reno Administrative Code

Sec. 8.16.060. - Duties of parents, guardians and all adult persons.

(a) It is unlawful for any adult to contribute to the delinquency of any minor without regard to age. The crime shall consist in any act by such adult in aiding, abetting or furthering the breach of any municipal ordinance or state statute by any minor, either before, after or during the fact thereof.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person who is a parent or guardian, or for any person who has been entrusted by a parent or guardian, to fail to supervise and attend to a child or children under the age of ten years.

Sparks Administrative Code

Section 10.48.180 - Locking persons in parked vehicles.

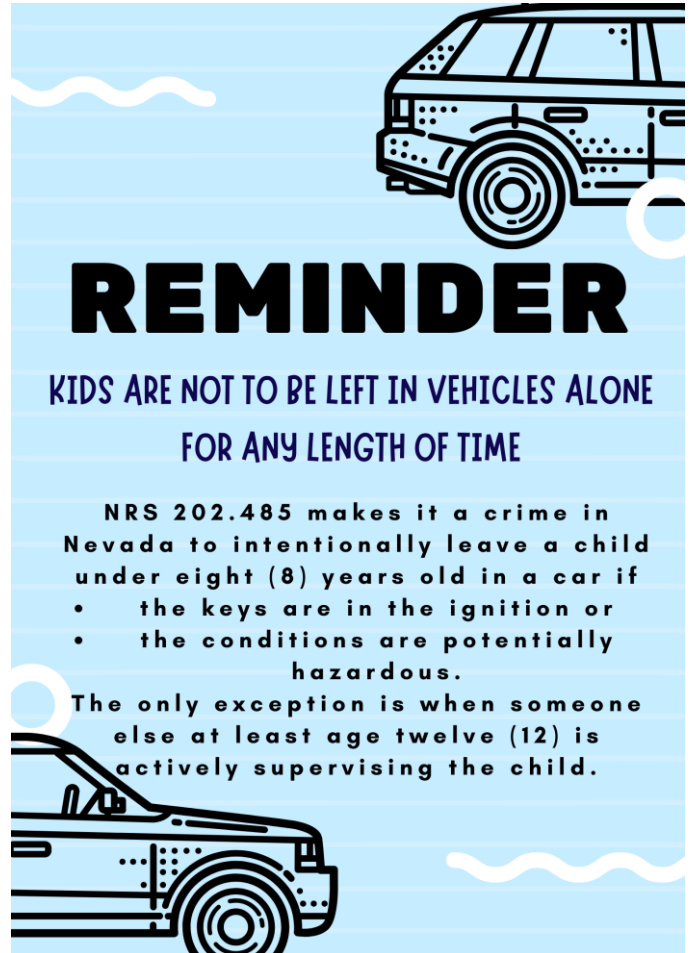
It is unlawful for any person to leave standing or parked any vehicle when the doors of the same are locked in which there is a person or persons who cannot readily escape therefrom.

Section 10.60.110 - Ignition keys in unattended vehicle.

A. No person driving or in charge of a motor vehicle shall permit it to remain unattended on any public street, highway or alley, or in any public parking lot, or in any place readily accessible to the public, without first stopping the engine, locking the ignition, removing the ignition key from the vehicle, effectively setting the brake thereon and, when upon any grade, turning the front wheels to the curb or side of the street or highway.

B. Whenever any police officer finds a motor vehicle unattended with the ignition key in the vehicle, in violation of this section, such police officer may remove such key from such vehicle and deliver it to the police station.

C. The registered owner of a vehicle found in violation of this section shall be held prima facie responsible for any such violation.



¿Sabías que?

NRS 202.485

Dejar al niño desatendido en un vehículo motorizado; pena; excepción.

1. Un padre, tutor legal u otra persona responsable de un niño de 7 años o menos no dejará a ese niño en un vehículo motorizado a sabiendas e intencionalmente si:

a) Las condiciones presentan un riesgo significativo para la salud y la seguridad del niño; o

b) El motor del vehículo de motor está en marcha o las llaves del vehículo están en el encendido, a menos que el niño esté siendo supervisado por y a la vista de una persona que tenga al menos 12 años.

Código Administrativo de Reno

Sección 8.16.060. - Deberes de los padres, tutores y todas las personas adultas.

a) Es ilegal que cualquier adulto contribuya a la delincuencia de cualquier menor sin tener en cuenta la edad. El delito consistirá en cualquier acto de dicho adulto para ayudar, instigar o promover el incumplimiento de cualquier ordenanza municipal o estatuto estatal por parte de cualquier menor, ya sea antes, después o durante el hecho de la misma.

b) Será ilegal que cualquier persona que sea padre o tutor, o cualquier persona a la que se haya encomendado un padre o tutor, no supervise y atienda a un niño o niños menores de diez años.

Código administrativo de Sparks

Sección 10.48.180 - Encerrar a las personas en vehículos estacionados.

Es ilegal que cualquier persona deje de pie o estacionado cualquier vehículo cuando las puertas del mismo estén cerradas con llave en las que haya una persona o personas que no puedan escapar fácilmente de él.

Sección 10.60.110 - Llaves de encendido en vehículo desatendido.

A. Ninguna persona que conduzca o esté a cargo de un vehículo motorizado permitirá que permanezca desatendido en ninguna calle, carretera o callejón público, o en cualquier estacionamiento público, o en cualquier lugar fácilmente accesible al público, sin detener primero el motor, bloquear el encendido, quitar la llave de contacto del vehículo, poner efectivamente el freno en el mismo y, cuando esté en cualquier grado, gire las ruedas delanteras hacia el bordillo o al lado de la calle o carretera.

B. Siempre que un oficial de policía encuentre un vehículo motorizado desatendido con la llave de contacto en el vehículo, en violación de esta sección, dicho oficial de policía puede quitar dicha llave de dicho vehículo y entregarla a la estación de policía.

C. El propietario registrado de un vehículo que se encuentre en violación de esta sección será considerado prima facie responsable de dicha violación.

If you have children who identify as gender fluid or non-binary, or children who do not celebrate Christmas, please indicate such on the form so that Project Sweet Dreams can accommodate accordingly. If you are unsure of which size to choose, go with the larger size—kids grow so fast!

All requests must be in by **Wednesday, November 29th**, but the earlier they receive them, the better! Pajamas will be labeled for each child and available for pick up in December at Center St. or the FEC. Someone will notify you where and when they are ready for pick up.

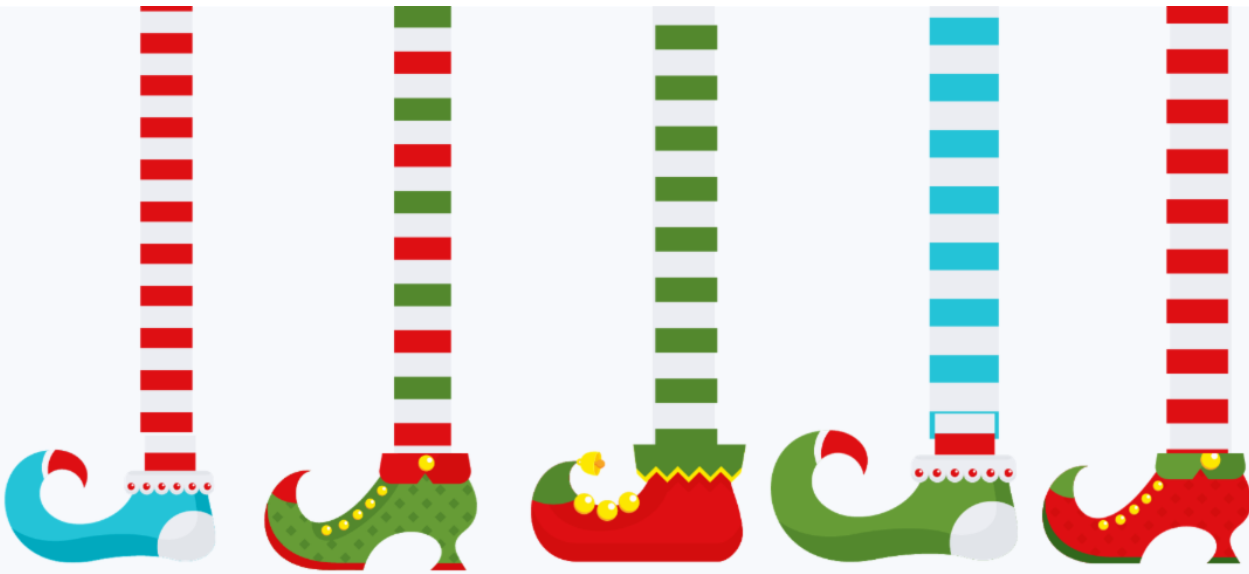
