KEYWORD

Normalcy

Means the condition of experiencing a typical childhood though participation in activities that are age or developmentally appropriate.

Reasonable and Prudent Parent Standard / Normalcy: The foster home will provide opportunities for children to experience and participate in normal activities which include involvement in community, school, family or social activities. Such activities not only allow foster children to experience normalcy in their daily lives but provide a child opportunity to experience safe risk-taking, supported by parental guidance and nurturing. These experiences ultimately support normal development and give the youth skills needed to be healthy and productive adults. Pursuant to NAC 424, a foster parent or designated member of the staff of a foster home, may allow a foster child to participate in extracurricular, enrichment, cultural and social activities similar to those participated in by peers of the same age, maturity and developmental level. When deciding whether to allow or deny participation in such activities, a foster parent or designated member of the staff of a foster home must be informed by all information about the activity that is available to the foster parent or staff member; and shall use the reasonable and prudent parent standard.

Regulation for Protection

We learn how to regulate our feelings and emotions as very young infants. Through our interactions, we learn how to filter information and how to respond to information. When children do not receive the nurture and care they need to develop optimally, their ability to self-regulate is disrupted. This can manifest in many ways, including tantrums, elopement, disrobing, melt downs and many other behaviors of concern. This presentation will provide attendees with an overview of how children learn to regulate their behaviors in infancy and how this develops as they grow. Additionally, the presentation will include strategies caregivers can use when children do not develop self-regulation strategies to help them learn this skill, regardless of their age. 1.5 hours

<u>Autism Spectrum Disorder for Child Welfare</u> <u>Professionals (CC)</u>

Jill Hill presents on Autism Spectrum Disorder as it pertains to Child Welfare Professionals (CWP). This training is designed to teach CWP how to approach individuals who may be diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder as well as discuss ways to ensure effective communication while interviewing and how to recognize patterns and behaviors exhibited by those with this diagnosis. Jill has experience in working with "Wrap Around Services" and although her training is usually geared towards first responders, she is excited to share how this information can positively impact Child Welfare. 1.5 Hours

Estos estresores adicionales a menudo pueden conducir a conflictos y luchas de poder en el hogar. El objetivo de esta presentación es proveer una interpretación más profunda del comportamiento resistente que podemos percibir en nuestra juventud, como la resistencia a las tareas del diario vivir, como completar el trabajo escolar o ayudar en las labores del hogar. También, ofrece herramientas y técnicas prácticas para los padres de crianza sobre cómo ayudar a los jóvenes a pasar de un comportamiento evitativo y resistente a la resiliencia y la formación de hábitos saludables.



I'd like to take this opportunity to share with each of you the 2021 schedule for foster care and adoption payments. The schedule was designed around the County's payment processing deadlines and every effort was made to issue payments as early in the month as possible. The current payment dates are as follows:

January 13, 2021 February 10, 2021 March 10, 2021 April 14, 2021

May 12, 2021 June 09, 2021 July 14, 2021 August 11, 2021 September 08, 2021 October 13, 2021 November 10, 2021 December 08, 2021

Checks are generated during the day listed above and mailed out late in the evening. Funds that are direct deposited are generally posted to your account late in the evening or early the following morning.

Washoe County is able to process payments via direct deposit for those who are interested. Please fill out the enclosed form and send to the following address:
