ANNOUNCEMENT! RATE INCREASE

Effective July 1, 2022, you will see a 10% increase to the daily foster care reimbursement rates for family foster homes and licensed relative/fictive kin homes. Rates haven't increased in over 2 decades and WCHSA did not want our providers to go another year without an increase. The state is also conducting an actuarial study to assess a more long-term increase and rate change. A huge thank you to Director Amber Howell and our fiscal team for making this increase possible!

Below are the new rates:

Family Foster Care:

\$44/day for the first 90 days a child is in legal custody \$33/day for over 90 days in legal custody

Licensed Relatives/Fictive Kin:

Age 0-12 is \$24.70/day Age 13+ is \$28.00/day

Reno Rodeo Closet

The Reno Rodeo Foundation generously provides clothing, teddy bears, and rolling backpacks to children who are newly placed into foster care or transitioning from an emergency placement.

Resource parents and children can visit the Reno Rodeo Closet to "shop" for clothing essentials, ensuring that the children can pick out items in the correct sizes and preferred style.

Tip: The closet is located right next door to the Child Advocacy Center, so visit following your new placement's medical evaluation!

If you have taken placement of a child who has an immediate clothing need and you absolutely cannot get to the closet, please email the attached request form to HSA-RRFCloset@washoecounty.gov and we will ensure the request is fulfilled. Please indicate in your email if you would prefer to pick up the items somewhere or have the child's case worker deliver at their next child contact.



Respite Reminder

This is just a friendly reminder that the remaining respite funds for this fiscal year expire on 6/30/22. We do not know yet if we will get respite funding next fiscal year, but of course will keep you all posted.

Respite funds can be used for true respite (cleared/approved person caring for your foster children), or inclusive respite which would be like a family vacation! Respite funds can be used for past respite/vacations as well!

10 & 8-years-old




These fun, silly, close-knit siblings are looking for an equally fun and active family to call their own.

If ANY household members exhibit any symptoms of COVID-19, even if mild, OR if they have been exposed to a COVID-19 positive person, OR if anyone in the household tests positive for COVID-19, that they must:

- 1. Contact the health department or their medical provider for guidance on testing.
- 2. Immediately self-isolate the household until medically cleared. This includes any in-person contact including visitation, meetings, appointments etc.
- 3. Notify the child(ren)'s caseworker(s) and the licensing worker within the same business day.

Substance use in Human Trafficking (cc)

Substance use and human trafficking occur together very often. Traffickers use drugs and alcohol to groom, lure, manipulate, and control the people they are trafficking. Victims and survivors who are substance dependent are targeted by traffickers because of this vulnerability. How can those who work with adults or youth who are sex and labor trafficked understand how to best support survivors who have substance use disorders? What do substance use disorder professionals need to know about human trafficking? How can we all do more to understand the intersection of substance use and trauma and how this can impact survivors over the short and long terms? (1 hour)

Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome & Substance Exposed **Infants**

This presentation provides an overview of Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) and Substance Exposed Infants (SEI). Topics discussed include symptoms, treatment, prevention efforts, reporting and resources. The presentation emphasizes a holistic, whole person-whole family, approach to care and treatment. (0.5 hour)

Diabetes Type 1: Diagnosis Specific Education

A general, informative, and educational presentation to support the previous learning of caregivers who are providing care for a child with Type 1 Diabetes. (0.5 hour)

Power Struggles

This presentation for parents is designed to provide evidence-based, practical information in dealing with Power Struggles. A trauma-informed approach is discussed to help parents understand why a reaction might occur and presents proven strategies for improvement. (0.5 hours)

Parenting a Child with Food Allergies

Parenting a Child with Food Allergies is designed to provide evidence-based, practical information for those caring for children with serious food allergies. (0.5 hours)

Understanding Autism

As the prevalence of Autism continues to rise across our nation, now up to 1 in 44 children, more families are caring for children diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Historically, children with ASD have been served using Applied Behavior Analysis, focusing on reducing problem behaviors and teaching skills. While this approach is effective, it does not take into consideration the relationship and connection that is so critical to our children's growth and development. This session discusses the utilization of Trust Based Relational Intervention (TBRI) with children with ASD and share how impactful this approach is using Connecting, Empowering, and Correcting Principles. (1 hour)

Teens & Technology: What to do when Technology is in Control? (cc)

The presentation discusses several of today's most popular technology platforms for youth and how to connect and protect them while accessing these platforms. The audience will learn the necessity of today's technology, interventions and strategies to build safe boundaries while also maintaining connection with teens, safeguards for the most popular platforms and how to access them, and how to determine healthy and unhealthy relationships with technology. (1 hour)

Washoe County School District

Don't Forget.

- All Boys & Girls Club locations are closed for training, the first and last week of the school year! This will affect only 2 school days (June 6th & 7th) Thank goodness!
- Check to make sure your student(s) are enrolled in the correct school next year. IC populates the zoned school by default, so we get to make it right!
- Check your students' IC accounts for grades and any missing assignments that need attention. If you are unable log into IC, you will need to call the school and get your password reset.
- PLEASE make sure your student is enrolled in summer school if they need extra support! Most of our kids do and it's only a few weeks, so it's always a good idea!
- Tutors are available over the summer, so please reach out to your worker to make the referral if this is needed – whether your student is in a summer school program or not!
- If your student needs transportation to/from summer school, please let the school know and let your worker know if there are any snags in that process!

FAQ – Educational Quick Facts re. Youth in Foster Care

INCLUDING important WCHSA policy updates!!
(Updated 9/30/21)

Did you know??

- SCHOOL OF ATTENDANCE: Foster youth have the right to remain at their School of Origin (see definition at end
 of document) when they come into care and/or change placements even if it's an adoptive placement to
 reduce additional disruptions and maintain their educational stability.
 - o WHY?
 - Often the school they attend when they come into care is the "only" stable environment in their world – while parents and placements are in flux.
 - Statistically, foster youth lose an average of 6 months of education for every school move/disruption.
 - WCHSA is bound by State and National legislation, to ensure that every effort is made to maintain our foster youth in their School of Origin.
 - IF it is determined to be in the best interest of the student to change schools, it MUST be
 approved by WCHSA leadership. This process is coordinated through the student's worker and
 the WCHSA educational liaison.
 - Foster Parents, relatives and fictive kid CANNOT change a youth's school without proper approval through WCHSA.
- TRANSPORTATION: Mileage reimbursement is available to whomever is assisting with transportation if there is
 no bus available. This applies to "anyone" transporting the youth, while the case is open.
 - The district tracks the miles, so you don't have to! The reimbursement is one round trip, based on mapped miles between school and placement address and is disbursed once a month (electronic payments are available!) for the prior month of transport.
- STRONG COMMUNICATION IS KEY
 - o The relationship with your student's school is your first line of defense in providing support.
 - Communicate with your worker when things get confusing or challenging.
- INFINITE CAMPUS: Get acquainted with Infinite Campus to follow student progress provide kudos earned and track missing assignments. "It takes a village" and caregivers are an essential part of that village!


