CHRISTMAS IS COMING!

It seems like every year the holidays arrive quicker than we are prepared for and once again the Pennington Foundation's generosity is here to save the day! For those not aware, the Pennington Foundation has graciously gifted foster children in WCHSA custody an unbelievably large grant for 2022 that encompasses Supplies, Clothing, and Christmas Gifts. So far, all children have been provided access to school SUPPLIES, CLOTHING, and now we are ready for the final (and for many, the most exciting) portion of the grant... CHRISTMAS PRESENT shopping days! As with supplies and clothing, the Christmas portion of the grant is only available to children in WCHSA custody who reside in Northern Nevada – if you are unsure if this pertains to you, please ask us. To sign-up for and attend a CHRISTMAS shopping day, please open the attachment, complete it and send it back to hsa-penningtonproject@washoecounty.gov.

Important things to note:

- 1. After sending in your RSVP form, you will receive a response that your request was received, and any additional information needed. Please call the FEC (775-352-3230) to follow up on your request or to sign up for a shopping day by phone.
- 2. Once you arrive at Target, you <u>must check-in at the table</u> located inside the store to obtain your 'shopping pass' at a time that HSA staff are present (see the attached form for times/days). Give yourself enough time to shop before your check-out time. It is super important that you separate items by child if you have more than one child you are shopping for.
- 3. WCHSA staff will be present at each event to assist you.
- 4. When done shopping, you will move to one of 2 check stands with WCHSA staff who will purchase your items. You must arrive in line no later than your check-out time (the time you sign up for).
- 5. <u>Unlike Clothing shopping days, children should not be in attendance at these events Christmas gifts should be surprises.</u>
- 6. We are allowing one shopping day per child for Christmas so all the items you choose will need to be made on your scheduled day.
- 7. If you were unable to attend one of the clothing shopping days, you will be able to purchase clothing at this time also. Please specify that on your RSVP.

The Reno Rodeo Foundation generously provides clothing, teddy bears, and rolling backpacks to children who are newly placed into foster care or transitioning from an emergency placement.

Resource parents and children can visit the Reno Rodeo Closet to "shop" for clothing essentials, ensuring that the children can pick out items in the correct sizes and preferred style.

The Reno Rodeo closet is open 24/7. The instructions to access the closet are below:

Step 1:

Visit the Kids Kottage Front Desk, located at 2075
Longley Lane. Inform the front desk staff that you
are there to check out keys for the Reno Rodeo
Closet. Please fill out the key check-out log to the
best of your ability.

Step 2:

The resource parent and child visit the Reno Rodeo Closet, located in the Kids Kottage Gym, 2085 Longley Lane. The Reno Rodeo closet is located through the double doors and to the right before you enter the gym.

Step 3:

The child picks out new clothing to meet their immediate needs.

There is no specific number of items available per child, but please be reasonable in the amount of items taken so that other children can have the same access to new clothing.

Sten 4:

Resource parent completes the RRF tracking sheet, located in an envelope next to the door, and places completed form back in the envelope upon exit. This step is very important as it helps the Reno Rodeo Foundation replenish the closet!

Please be mindful to leave the closet in an orderly condition following your visit.

Step 5:

Resource parent locks both the Reno Rodeo Closet door and the KK Gym door upon exit.


Step 6:

Resource parent returns key and completes sign out log.

Tip: The closet is located right next door to the Child Advocacy Center, so visit following your new placement's medical evaluation!

If you have taken placement of a child who has an immediate clothing need and you absolutely cannot get to the closet, please email the attached request form to HSA-RRFCloset@washoecounty.gov and we will ensure the request is fulfilled. Please indicate in your email if you would prefer to pick up the items somewhere or have the child's case worker deliver at their next child contact.

Trust Based Relational Intervention® (TBRI®) is an evidence-based parenting and intervention model developed by Dr. Karyn Purvis and Dr. David Cross at the Karyn Purvis Institute of Child Development (KPICD) at Texas Christian University (TCU). TBRI® has been built on a solid foundation of neuropsychological theory and research, tempered by family-based intervention, designed for children who have experienced relationship-based traumas such as institutionalization, multiple foster and/or neglect.


LGBTQ+
